

Approved Supply List for Most Cruises

With the exception of just a few items, most of your scrapbooking and crafting supplies should be packed in durable suitcases or scrapbook totes to be **checked** with your other luggage. The exceptions to this are your photos and electronic devices such as Cricut or other electronic die cutting machines, laptop computers, and iPads, etc., which must be hand-carried through security.

Below is a list of approved scrapbooking and craft items. If you need to bring something that is not part of this list, check with the cruise line before bringing it.

Please note: Items on this list which are highlighted in **green** and begin with a * are on the cruise line's "Prohibited Items" list. Individuals cannot generally bring these items onboard, however, they are sometimes allowed for group scrapbooking and craft cruises. Items highlighted in **blue** may also be prohibited, depending on the cruise line. Regarding **scissors**, many cruise lines do allow these as long as the blades are less than four inches long. Check with your travel agent or the cruise line for specific information.

Approved Supply List for Air Travel

From the TSA website: Planning ahead and packing properly can facilitate the screening process and ease your travel experience at the airport. Know what you can pack in your carry-on and checked baggage before arriving at the airport by reviewing the lists [here](#). Even if an item is generally permitted, it may be subject to additional screening or not allowed through the checkpoint if it triggers an alarm during the screening process, appears to have been tampered with, or poses other security concerns. The final decision rests with the TSA officer on whether an item is allowed through the checkpoint.

Please note: Items on this list which are highlighted in **green** and begin with a * are generally allowed in checked luggage only or with special instructions. Items highlighted in **blue** are strictly prohibited. Regarding **scissors**, many airlines do allow these as long as the blades are less than four inches long. Check with your travel agent or the airline for specific information.

PROHIBITED ITEMS – DO NOT BRING: Aerosol or flammable paint, turpentine or paint thinner, Copic marker refills, solvents, Un-Do, or Staz-On adhesive remover.
